

The power of a word

Have you ever watched a loving mother with her new baby? She's communicating with the infant all the time, with words and smiles and coos and kisses. The newborn, you can imagine, doesn't have the slightest idea what all these signs and sounds mean. He or she is receiving a lot of white noise and wet lips. Yet behavioral science has proven that even if the baby doesn't know what "I love you" means, or what sort of pledge a kiss constitutes, the message is nonetheless received. The baby who doesn't get this sort of stimulus languishes. Some may even fail to thrive if deprived of the sounds and signs of nurture which are as vital as food.

And so your lives are planted with seeds from the first hours, even from the womb. You soak in your mother's anxiety or anticipation; you receive all of her earliest messages loud and clear. Every word swirling in the air around you is planted down deep inside too: whether it's your parents' whispered endearments to each other or the sound of angry shouting in another room. Hard language and tenderness are sown into the early ground of your being: affirmation—and disapproval. Unqualified acceptance—or no-matter-what-I-do rejection. Words don't fade away but are recorded and replayed both consciously and subconsciously. Children of abuse often testify that while the bruises of the body may heal and vanish, words of diminishment ground into their souls never entirely go away.

Words are so powerful and so permanent that God created all there is in a series of utterances. Words became flesh and took on reality. God inaugurated the salvation of the world in the same way: The divine word became incarnate and indelible in Jesus. In turn Jesus scatters beautiful words of life far and wide across time and space. You and I are recipients of that grace. Divine words that give life are liberally spread across the assembly every weekend. These are ancient words, yet as new as you are! And if this generation is to have its harvest, you are obliged to take these words to heart and let them bear fruit through you.

Maybe you will. Maybe you won't. You may be heading down a hard path that beautiful words just can't attach to. Or you may embrace the good words but never apply them so they wither and die in you for lack of a genuine reception. You may give the holy word an audience until words of self-interest come calling and you answer those instead. Fearful words may seem more convincing than promises of healing, hope, and second chances. Your world is full of words: tempting, promising, appealing, denying. You and I have to choose which words, in the long run, will define us and produce in us what's most precious.
